



#### **BUFFALO TRANSIT COMPANY** – Norman G. Peters

"I rode these busses as a boy."

#### **Brief History**

- A. Founded circa 1927 Independent Bus Company had routes from downtown Buffalo to Towns/Villages to East Sloan, Cheek to Wala, Depew, Lancaster, Alden to as far east as Akron.
- B. 1930/1931 added limited routes to South/Southwest to Hamburg and Orchard Park.
- C. 1961 purchased by Niagara Frontier Transit Co. Most BTC routes merged into Niagara Falls Transit system.
- D. 1965 all B.T.C. routes merged into Niagara Falls Transit system. Limited number of B.T.C. busses continued to be used as B.T.C. specialty services. Bus barns still exist with faded paint name visible.

#### Maumee and Perrysburg Toll Bridge Co. – Dual Category Transit / Civil War Token



There are a number of transit tokens that fall into multiple categories. One of these is the Maumee and Perrysburg Toll Bridge Token from Perrysburg, Ohio. The Maumee & Perrysburg Bridge Company issued and sold tokens for passage across the Maumee river bridge. These tokens are cataloged as both transit and civil war tokens. Government-issued coins were scarce during the American Civil War from 1862 to 1865, and many entities issued their own pseudo coinage for various purposes to facilitate commerce. One such token is the piece shown below. It is cataloged as Ohio 726-B In Atwood's transit catalog and as Ohio 540-B-1b R6 in Fuld's Civil War Catalog. Information on the toll valuation could not be found.

There are two varieties of this token known, struck in brass and copper dated 1863. The company name on the obverse and an image of winged Mercury on the reverse. This piece is the brass example listed as Ohio 726-B in Atwood's. It is 19mm with a given valuation of \$165.00. The copper piece — Ohio 726-A is not as rare with a valuation of \$125.00. The example shown recently was auctioned on eBay by Steve Hayden and realized \$380.00 with 34 bidders. Interest from two groups of collectors can generate strong prices even if the token is not in excellent condition.

#### Northern Kentucky Transit - Dayton Kentucky 200-A - 7½ Cent Fare Token

In the early 1900's the Northern Kentucky Transit company was formed. It operated an independent interurban street car line running from Dayton, Kentucky through the river cities across the Ohio River Robeling Bridge to Cincinnati. The line was never profitable and the investors sold the operation and rolling stock to the Green Line company. The Green Line was the consolidation of several small local street car companies operating in the northern Kentucky area that continued into the 1950's.

Northern Kentucky Transit only issued a single token which is rare and seldom seen. The token shown below is listed as Dayton Kentucky 200-A in Atwood's transit catalog. It is 20mm across the flats, octagonal, being struck in aluminum. Mintage quantity is not known and the token is given a catalog valuation of \$100.00. One recent – April 2021 - auction of the piece shown below on eBay realized \$110.07 with three bidders.

# THE JERSEY SHORE ELECTRIC STREET RAILWAY

In 1901, the New York Central Railroad announced that it would build a large rail car facility just east of the town of Jersey Shore, Pennsylvania. As an inducement for workers and businesses to favor Jersey Shore over other towns in the area, land was acquired for rights-of-way and the Jersey Shore Electric Street Railway—a trolley line running from the town to the New York Central shops—was constructed. A few years later, a second trolley line (the Jersey Shore & Antes Fort Railway) went into service.

A community with no rail connections to a city suddenly had two. Jersey Shore metamorphosed from a minor stop on a local stagecoach line to a major industrial boom town.


As far as being a collectable item, the Jersey Shore Electric Street Railway token certainly qualifies. The operating agency went out of business in 1925; only 5,000 of the tokens were ever produced—and they were only in use for three years!



Tokens for the Jersey Shore Elevated Street Railway were introduced in 1922. Before then, you would've had to use tickets.

The stagecoach became obsolete—trolleys provided service between Jersey Shore and the Pennsylvania Railroad Station in Antes Fort. According to the Jersey Shore *Herald* (December 6, 1913), "Eight cars run daily making use of 20th century transportation methods by the use of electric power, solving the problem of local rapid transit."

The corner of Locust and South Main Streets was the end of the line in Jersey Shore. But there wasn't a turnaround track; instead, the contact arm connecting to the overhead cable was reversed, and the backs of the seats were flipped over, setting up the car for a return trip.



#### Soap Spawns Tokens

If you are going shopping for household items, why not get some transit tokens at the same time? That was the thought in 1958 of B. T. Babbitt Company and the Hudson Pulp and Paper Company. So they approached the Philadelphia Transportation Co., and the New York City Transit Authority. The idea was the brainchild of Marshall S. Lachner, President of Babbitt.

Each company marketed five products. Their proposal was to put coupons on the products so four coupons could be redeemed at the transit operation for one ride token. On June 24, 1958, the PTC Board of Directors approved the plan in principle, subject to a final agreement between the Executive Committee and the supplier companies. Managers in the Transportation Department were involved in outlining the parameters of the plan. The agreement was signed on August 14, to be effective September 22.

The promotion slogan was "Ride Free with PTC." The coupons would be on Babbitt products of Cameo Copper cleaner, Bab-O cleanser, Glin detergent, Hep oven cleaner, and Air Gene room deodorizers. The Hudson products were napkins, paper towels, toilet paper and facial tissue. A combination of any four coupons of the products could be used for one token. PTC would be reimbursed at the regular token rate of 18 cents for each four coupons. Passengers using the Ben Franklin Bridge Line would pay the usual additional 2½ cent token, or 3 cent cash Bridge Line toll. No combination of coupons and cash would be allowed, except on the Bridge Line.

Products carrying the coupons would be available in Philadelphia, Montgomery, Delaware and Bucks counties in PA, and Camden County, NJ, for three months from the starting date. PTC would accept them until March 15, 1959. Babbitt and Hudson estimated that 10 million product items would be labeled with the coupons. They would also wage a joint, all out advertising campaign, including counter displays in more than 2,000 supermarkets, grocery stores, and retail outlets.

The PTC President, Douglas Pratt, thanked the companies "for giving PTC the opportunity to demonstrate. ... the convenience, value, and vitality of public transportation." In September, Depot orders were published to all Surface Division Platform Employees, and Hi Speed Division Cashiers, announcing that the promotion would start Monday, September 22. They were not to accept more than four coupons from one passenger at one time. Coupons were also not to be exchanged for a token unless used for a ride at the time presented. A free transfer would be issued upon request. The coupons were to be turned in as "tokens returned" with their Waybill and change fund.

There is no record of the number of coupons PTC redeemed, or the Company's judgement of the success of the promotion. NYCTA evidently began its promotion before PTC, but only with Babbitt. No details of its program are known, but one NYCTA coupon is shown below with the PTC ones. Note it took only three coupons to get a token, vs. four on PTC.

#### Peace Bridge 1 Pedestrian Fare Token - Buffalo, N Y -105-B by C Judge #1566

The **Peace Bridge** is an international bridge between Canada and the **United States** at the east end of Lake Erie at the source of the **Niagara River**, about 20 kilometres (12.4 mi) upriver of Niagara Falls. It connects Buffalo, New York in the United States to Fort Erie, Ontario in Canada. Construction of the bridge started in 1925 and was completed in 1927. It is operated and maintained by the binational Buffalo and Fort Erie Public Bridge Authority. The Peace Bridge consists of five arched spans over the Niagara River and a Parker deck type truss span over the Black Rock Canal on the American side of the river. The length is 5,800 feet (1.77 km). The Peace Bridge was named to commemorate 100 years of peace between the United States and Canada. It was constructed as a highway bridge to address pedestrian and motor vehicle traffic which could not be accommodated on the **International Railway Bridge** built in 1873.

Over the years the bridge authority has issued several tokens good for various types of crossings. The example shown below is the earliest being issued in 1927 in unknown quantity. It was good for one pedestrian crossing at an unknown cost. The token is 21mm, struck in brass. Listed in Atwood's catalog as New York, Buffalo 105-B it is given a \$3.50 valuation. This valuation is very low based on a recent eBay auction in June, 2021 where this example brought \$31.00 with 12 bids.

#### Charlotte, N.C. Multi Use BiMetallic Token – NC 160-R by C. Judge #1566

In the 1990's Charlotte, N.C. was in the midst of revitalizing sections of its downtown center city. Public transit was a major focus with a central hub called the Transportation Center. Bus, electric light rail and electric street car services all join at this location. A modern light rail route (blue line) runs north / south a total of 18.3 miles. A retro electric streetcar system (gold line) runs east / west connecting residential neighborhoods to businesses and educational facilities. The streetcars used on the gold line are modeled after the Birney style trolleys and get their power from overhead lines.

Center City Transit issued ten different combination use tokens over a fourteen year period. They were bi-metallic good for on street parking and transit fares. The tokens have been obsoleted and replaced with a fare card system. When issued each of the tokens commemorated the opening of a new downtown facility, art venue, stadium, etc. The token shown below is listed as N.C. 160-R in Atwood's transit catalog. It was struck in brass with an 8mm steel center and is 23mm in diameter. Mintage was 5000 pieces and a \$1.50 valuation assigned. Assembling a complete set of all ten varieties would be a challenge. Recent auction results run from \$2-10 depending on condition.

#### Discussion

Missoula has supplied us with 3 new tokens, regular issueS from 2020 and 2022 and a commemorative dated 2022 for Chuck Kaparich who passed away in 2021. Mr. Kaparich was instrumental in the original promotion of the carousel in 1995. Kaparich, who was a cabinet maker by trade, hand carved the first horses for the carousel.

Hayden Island and Tomahawk Island are two islands connected to one another on the Columbia River between Portland OR and Vancouver WA. In 1917, the Interstate Bridge opened and streetcar service was provided from both Portland and Vancouver to the islands.

Lotus Isle Amusement Park was located on Tomahawk Island east of the much longer lasting Jantzen Beach Park (on Hayden Island) which also issued several tokens. During its brief existence, Lotus Island was the largest amusement park in Portland and had 40 attractions including bumper cars for which the above token was issued.

Lotus Isle was a financial failure. Several unfortunate incidents marred its existence. Shortly after its grand opening in 1930, a child slipped from a ladder and drowned. Feeling himself to blame, the owner of the park committed suicide the next day. In 1931, the park's ballroom burned. After poor attendance in 1932 and with the impact of the depression, the park closed for good.

The catalog lists all Autobus Fournier tokens from Quebec City as having the same design on both sides. This is true for all except PQ 745 H which has a circle around the design on the obverse but not on the reverse.





#### **Convention Auction 2022**

An important part of the annual Convention is the Auction. Last year, COVID overshadowed much of our proceedings. Many possible attendees stayed home. As a result, the in-person attendance suffered. We only had 11 in-person bidders. Mail bidding also was down from previous years. I have been gathering input as to why interest has declined. Some newer members say that many of the tokens submitted far exceed their respective budgets. Long-time members want more rare (and subsequently costly) items. Some say, "There's not much variety".

In an effort to increase participation and add more variety/ interest, I have increased the number of lots offered to 400. I have also added some additional categories to this year's Auction:

- 1) Multi Token Lots. You can combine up to 3 tokens as one lot. The combined Catalog Value must be at least \$5.00.
- 2) Condition Related Lots. Tokens that are "less than perfect". These could be holed tokens whose Catalog listing is "solid". They could have rim nicks, wear issues, etc. These would have minimum bids of 1/2 to 3/4 of the listed Catalog Value.
- 3) Non-Token Transit Memorabilia. Token holders, hat badges, paper tickets, passes, lapel pins, ticket punches, AVA items, commemorative tokens, etc. (Submitter would need to list their minimum bid). For mailing purposes, these items should be no larger than 12" x 12" x 5&1/2" and weigh less than one pound.

An auction can only be as good as its contents. I NEED YOUR HELP. Every member has items they could submit. If you are downsizing your collection, consider sending some of your "better" tokens. Whether it's combining a couple of your duplicate lower Catalog Value tokens, sending less than perfect tokens, submitting unusual items from the back corners of your desk/



#### Spring & Sixth Street Railway Co. – Los Angeles, CA # 450-A - By Curtis Judge

On July 1, 1874, the modest, horse-drawn cars of the Spring & Sixth Street Railroad became the first streetcars to roll down L.A. streets. Founded by lawyer Robert M. Widney, the Spring & Sixth operated a regular schedule, running cars hourly on weekdays between 6:30 a.m. and 10 p.m. For a ten-cent fare, passengers could ride the 1.5-mile route from the intersection of Temple and Spring south to Sixth, and then west to Figueroa. Widney had built the Spring & Sixth in part to boost land sales near the intersection of Hill and Fourth—then a sparsely populated area where Widney owned land, far beyond the central business district. The Spring & Sixth St. RR issued a single token in 1874 shortly after it's opening. Mintage is not known but assumed to be very small due to the size of the operation. The token is listed as Calif 450-A in Atwood's catalog with a valuation of \$210.00. It is uniface, 23mm, incuse struck in brass with black paint used to highlight the wording. A January 2022 eBay auction of the token shown below realized \$203.56 with 21 bids.

### <u>Kensington & Frankford Plank Road Token – Philadelphia, PA #750-D</u> <u>By Curtis Judge # 1566</u>

Private turnpikes and plank roads were business corporations that built and maintained a road for the right to collect fees from users. In the wet seasons, most roads were impassable seas of mud. The plank road was much cheaper to construct than gravel or macadam surfaces and was usable year around. One common arrangement was two rows of timbers that were laid 4-5 feet apart then 3" thick planks laid perpendicular to form the roads surface. Ditches were dug alongside to provide drainage. The Kensington and Frankford Plank Road Co. received a charter on February 13,1853 to follow what is now Kensington Ave. in Philadelphia, Pa. The company operated until 1873 when the charter ended and the road became free. At one time in the 1860's there were 14 separate plank roads in operation near Philadelphia.

Kensington & Frankford Co. issued 2 different toll tokens during their operating years. Both were incuse struck, uniface, 28mm in diameter each being struck in copper and brass. All varieties carry a catalog valuation of \$300.00 and are seldom available. Toll values of 3 and 6 are known, a higher toll was charged for a larger vehicle or number of horses. The specimen shown below is listed in Atwood's catalog as Pennsylvania 750-D in copper. This token sold in a December 2021 eBay auction realizing a price of \$232.50 with 11 bids. Other examples of the 6 token have sold for as much as \$600.00 in recent auctions.



# <u>Birmingham City Transport – 1D – Fare Token – England 80-CA</u> <u>By Curtis Judge # 1566</u>

**Birmingham City Transport** was the local authority-owned provider of road-based public transport within the city limits of Birmingham, England, between 1899 and 1969. It was locally known as the Corporation Buses. Initially, it was called Birmingham Corporation Tramways, and, after the first motor bus services started in July 1914, it became Birmingham Corporation Tramways and Omnibus. Finally, in November 1937, it was renamed Birmingham City Transport, though Birmingham itself had been a City since 1889. BCT was incorporated into the West Midlands Passenger Transport Executive (a regional government agency) in 1969 along with three other city operations ending it's independent operation.

Birmingham City Transport issued nine different tokens during it's 1937-1969 operating life. This example shown below is listed as Birmingham 80-CA in Smith's 1990 transit catalog. It is 23mm being struck in red celluloid in an unknown quantity. Catalog value is \$0.30; however, recent auctions ended with sales in the \$2-4.00 range depending on condition. Other issues in this series of tokens all used the same Birmingham city coat of arms on the obverse with values of 1 ½, 2, 3, and 4 D on the reverse. Colors used were pink, orange, green (2 vars), and blue (2 vars) and red.

Birmingham City Transport used a common livery design on it's rolling stock through the various company configurations. The body of the vehicle was always a yellowish cream color with dark green stripes and body accents. The company used double deck vehicles where ever possible due to their increased passenger carrying capacity. This image is one of the electric trolleys run by Birmingham Corporation Tramways.





This image is a restored example of one of the Leyland Titan PD2/1 buses used by the company in the 30-40's, a double deck design.





Finally this image is one of the buses used in the 50-60's prior to the consolidation. It is also a high capacity double deck design.

# Needham Mite Minibus – One Fare Token – Needham, Mass # 545-B By Curtis Judge # 1566

In 1979 the town of Needham instituted a bus service for its residents. The service was called the Mite Minibus due to the size (20 passengers) of the buses used. The operation was small consisting of just two buses running two separate routes within the town limits. The tokens were primarily sold to merchants at a discount to stimulate ridership and patronage of downtown businesses and good for one \$0.75 fare. The Mite service lasted until 1984 when it was closed due to town budget considerations.

The token shown below was used by the system being produced in a quantity of 2500 pieces in 1979. The blue plastic token measures 29mm across the flats and uses incuse white lettering. A total of 6 varieties are known to exist, 5 with merchant stickers attached to the blank reverse. Merchants known are Tidbits & Tortes, Taylors Stationary, Cheese Etc., Needham Garden Center and Wells Shoes. Only the blank reverse piece is listed in

Atwood's as Mass 545-B because the ones with stickers were not official issues. Catalog valuation is \$0.75, no auction results are available. One December 2021 seller on eBay lists multiples of the token at \$6.99, buy it now, showing 8 sold and 9 still available. A complete set of all 6 varieties would be very difficult to assemble, the merchant examples were produced individually in very small quantities.





# **APRIL NEW ISSUE SERVICE**

I have started to prepare NIS 22-01 to be shipped in mid-April. St. Joseph, MI issued two tokens each year 2010 to 2019. The Zinc with Nickle/Silver plate, which we have known about and distributed and a brass, which was unknown to us till recently. In 2020 only a brass was made. In 2021 and 2022 only the Zinc with Nickle/Silver plating was made. 2022 may get a brass later if the operation is able to resume "normal" operation. Both 2018 and 2019 are in short supply but it is hoped those two years tokens will come in this summer when token usage resumes. Missoula also resumed tokens issuing with three new tokens.

# **Discussion**

The bus company in Watertown SD has changed its name to Community Transit and has issued 2 new tokens, one for \$3 and the other for \$5. We do not yet have the details of the \$5 token.

Kris Olson sent me a photograph of KY 641 A which has the N'PT designation. I have also seen a photo of KY 641 B which shows the N'PT lettering. I assume that KY 641 C to F also have N'PT. The tokens, however, have been listed as NP'T in all catalogs from A-C 1 forward

Harley Mark reported that the Richland Carrousel in Mansfield, Ohio issued annual tokens from 1991 to 1998. These tokens were not previously listed because prior to the rule change a few years ago, carousel tokens had to contain the words "good for a ride" or something equivalent.

Starting in 1999, the Richland Carrousel used these words on their tokens. The tokens prior to 1999 are now eligible to be considered regular listings. The 1993 token was issued both with a reeded edge and with a smooth edge.

AVA member Dave Ferguson has gone through his collection and has compared the wording on each token to what is shown in the catalog. He has found several hundred discrepancies. Most of these discrepancies date back to catalogs prior to the 7<sup>th</sup> edition. Since it will require a considerable amount of Fare Box space to document all of these discrepancies, I will discuss them over a number of issues. Most of the corrections involve missing or extraneous punctuation marks, misspelled words, or 1 mm size changes.

In this Fare Box, I am including all tokens which appeared in the 6<sup>th</sup> edition but for which the wording in the 6<sup>th</sup> edition is correct but the wording in the 7<sup>th</sup> edition is not. I am also listing changes for Alabama through Maine tokens which require corrections in both editions. In future Fare Boxes, I will list 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> edition changes for the remainder of the states and provinces and then list corrections for tokens first listed after the 6<sup>th</sup> edition.

In general, the vast majority of wood tokens are 38 mm. The catalog has incorrectly listed many of them as being 39 mm. There are a few that really are 39 mm such as CA 845 K and the rarely seen WI 330 K.

The Pc and Ch designations have been inconsistent in the past. I am now considering a token which has a hole in the center to be Ch. If the hole is not in the center, it will be Pc.

Starting with A-C 7, slash marks are used to designate line separations for tokens valued at \$100 or more or for tokens in which line separations are necessary to distinguish different tokens from one another. Therefore, we are removing the slash marks on any token not in those categories. Of course, slash marks which are actually on the token will remain.

Dave has also reported a number of currently unlisted tokens which will be included in a future Fare Box.



AVAfounded in 1948

Oaks Park is among the oldest continually operating amusement parks in America. It is located in the Sellwood neighborhood 10 minutes from downtown Portland. The Oaks first opened to eager visitors on May 30, 1905. Arriving via streetcar, visitors to the park were thrilled by exotic animals, nightly fireworks, a bath house, death defying amusement rides, and the latest of inventions, electric lights! Today when visitors arrive they are delighted by a uniquely Portland blend of modern thrill rides and turn-of-the-century charm on a midway that has delighted for generations.

The Oaks normally uses paper tickets for admission to the rides. When a company or group rents out the park for a function, tokens were used to differentiate them from other paying customers. Seven different tokens, each good for one ride, were issued from 1980-1983. The two tokens shown below were used for the 1982-83 season. Both are anodized aluminum, 23mm in diameter. In the Atwood Coffee transit catalog the green token is listed as Portland 700-V and the red as 700-X, both being given a \$15.00 valuation. A 2022 eBay listing offers the pair at a "buy it now" price of \$14.99. The other tokens had much higher mintages and corresponding lower valuations.

The Taft-Norco Ferry token was listed in tokencatalog.com. The size was not specified in the listing. By the mid 20<sup>th</sup> century, the Taft-Norco Ferry was one of three ferries crossing the Mississippi River west of New Orleans. The ferries were operated by the Louisiana Department of Transportation. The others were the Luling-Destrehan Ferry and the Edgard-Reserve Ferry. The Taft-Norco Ferry was pedestrian only while the other two carried vehicles.

PA 999 C – reverse – change signed to sd (to be consistent with the other NAVY YARD token descriptions)

On October 20, 1976, a horrible accident occurred involving the Luling-Destrehan Ferry. While fully loaded, the ferry was struck by a tanker. The ferry capsized killing 78 of the 96 passengers and crew aboard. This was the worst ferry accident in American history. In October 1983, the Hale Boggs Bridge was opened connecting Luling and Destrehan. At that time, the Luling ferry discontinued operation. Presumably, the Taft-Norco Ferry also ceased operations at about the same time.

As discussed in the April 2022 Fare Box, AVA member Dave Ferguson has gone through his collection and has compared the wording on each token to what is shown in the catalog. He has found several hundred discrepancies. Most of these discrepancies date back to catalogs prior to the 7<sup>th</sup> edition. Since it will require a considerable amount of Fare Box space to document all of these discrepancies, I will discuss them over a number of issues. Most of the corrections involve missing or extraneous punctuation marks, misspelled words, or 1 mm size changes.

In this Fare Box, I am listing changes for Maryland through Pennsylvania tokens which require corrections in both editions.





# <u>Centralia Center City Railway Co – Centralia, Illinois</u> Atwood-Coffee #130-A


Centralia Center City Railway Co. was a horsecar trolley line formed in 1892 in the south central Illinois city of Centralia. The line was profitable, expanded and was electrified in 1906. Centralia Central City Traction Co. purchased the operation and rolling stock in 1912 at which time it had 3 ½ miles of track with a spur line running from Centralia to Wamac. Trollies were abandoned for gasoline buses in 1930.

CCC Railway Company issued two tokens during its life. The 17mm white metal example shown below is listed as Illinois 130-A in the Atwood-Coffee transit catalog. Mintage is not known with the piece being given a \$12.00 valuation. As typical of the era, the fare was 5 cents. A 17mm aluminum token using the same die work was also issued and is cataloged as #130-B. Past sales have shown valuations of \$10-16.00 for the 130-A token being determined by condition of the token.




The AVA is hoping that this idea will create more interest in the auction and possibly the AVA Convention. This years convention is in Iowa and we hope to see you.





#### **Discussion**

AVA member Dave Ferguson has gone through his collection and has compared the wording on each token to what is shown in the catalog. He has found several hundred discrepancies. Most of these discrepancies date back to catalogs prior to the 7<sup>th</sup> edition. Since it will require a considerable amount of Fare Box space to document all of these discrepancies, I will discuss them over a number of issues. Most of the corrections involve missing or extraneous punctuation marks, misspelled words, or 1 mm size changes.

In this Fare Box, I am listing changes for Rhode Island through West Virginia tokens which require corrections in both editions. I am also listing corrections for Alabama through West Virginia tokens first listed after A-C 6. In the next Fare Box, I will list corrections for Wisconsin and District of Columbia, for Canadian provinces, and for the various token designations not considered regular listings.

The Osceola, AR token was posted in the World of Tokens Facebook Group. Osceola was on the St.Louis to Memphis division of the Frisco Railroad.

Indianapolis IN 460 AE is the same as IN 460 A except that it has periods after ST. and RR. IN 460 AE appeared in an eBay auction in May 2022. Pictures of IN 460 A are in tokencatalog.com and do not have periods. Therefore, I am considering IN 460 AE to be a new listing.

MI 680 J and WA880 F are identical except that MI 680 J is 1.32 mm thick while WA 880 F is .94 mm thick.

Winona Transit is now using 3 tokens. MN 980 L was already listed. MN 980 M and N are new listings.

# Three Rivers Carousel Ride Token - Kennewick, WA

By Curtis Judge #1566

In 1910, the children of St. Joseph, Michigan, spent their days at the Silver Beach Amusement Park, riding one of the most exquisite carousels ever built. The cost was twenty-five cents for a three-minute ride on their most beloved horse or chariot. Charles Carmel, the master carver of the gentle, yet energetic-looking horses, created them with love and precision. His horses thrived in St. Joseph for sixty-two years. The Silver Beach Carousel was dismantled in 1972, before finding its way to a new home in Roswell, New Mexico where it sat in storage for 30 years. In the year 2002, Ken Johanning and Phil Slusser discovered the hidden gem of the Silver Beach Carousel and committed themselves to bringing it to the Tri-Cities of Washington. Fund raising for restoration and installation was slow with most of the work performed by volunteers. The carousel finally reopened to the public in 2014.

As part of the fund raising effort ride tokens were sold starting in 2004. The 29mm brass token shown below was minted by the Hoffman Mint in 2004. It is not known if it is currently used for rides on the carousel. This example is in uncirculated condition and listed as Washington 440-A in Atwoods transit catalog with a valuation of \$1.00. A current listing on eBay offers uncirculated pieces for a buy it now price of \$2.49.



The carousel now resides in a new fully enclosed year around use building which offers a snack bar, gift shop and event spaces.



# <u>The Short Way Bridge – Newport, Kentucky – One Passage Token</u> By Curtis Judge #1566

The original Short Way bridge across the Licking River was a wooden structure that was deemed unsafe and replaced. The replacement bridge, a fourteen panel steel truss design with two traffic lanes was constructed in 1914 and 1915. The second bridge was closed to traffic on April 2, 2001 and scheduled for demolition in 2003. In September of 2001, the new Licking Valley Girl Scouts Bridge on 11th St. in Covington and Newport, Kentucky opened. The second Short Way Bridge was originally part of a toll road, tolls were last collected in 1986. The toll to cross the bridge had been ten cents for vehicles and one cent for pedestrians. A discount rate of 20 tokens for \$1.50 was offered for frequent bridge commuters.

In 1967 the bridge operating authority issued a 26mm brass token with a center cut "S" that was good for one passage. 100,000 pieces were struck in the initial order with two subsequent orders being placed in 1974. The token is commonly available to collectors and is listed in the Atwood-Coffee transit catalog as Kentucky 640-A with a valuation of \$0.25. Sale prices on eBay in May, 2022 show "Buy It Now" listings from \$1.49-3.00 depending on condition.



# **Discussion**

AVA member Dave Ferguson has gone through his collection and has compared the wording on each token to what is shown in the catalog. He has found several hundred discrepancies. Most of these discrepancies date back to catalogs prior to the 7<sup>th</sup> edition. Since it will require a considerable amount of Fare Box space to document all of these discrepancies, I will discuss them over a number of issues. Most of the corrections involve missing or extraneous punctuation marks, misspelled words, or 1 mm size changes.

In this Fare Box, I am listing changes for Wisconsin, District of Columbia, US Territories, and Canadian tokens which require corrections in both editions. I am also listing changes for amusement ride tokens, club tour tokens, and timetable tokens.

I will complete Dave's changes in the August 2022 Fare Box.

On a recent trip to Montana, I stopped by the Spirit of Columbia Gardens Carousel in Stodden Park in Butte and to my surprise, I discovered that they are using tokens. I also stopped by the Great Northern Carousel in Helena. The Great Northern Carousel is still using tokens and had a large jar containing hundreds of tokens. I definitely saw MT 480 Q and S in the jar but did not have an opportunity to check if MT 480 R is still available.

Yet another Scheels Ferris Wheel has opened. This one is in Sioux Falls SD.

One Prescott AAA taxi token was previously listed in the transportation related section. Larry Dziubek has provided 6 additional ones, each of which was sponsored by either a hotel or a tavern.

Last fall, when this project was started, the plan envisioned submitting U.S. Parking Tokens previously not cataloged, or tokens in need of a modification to be published in the AVA FARE BOX. This was to allow collectors who had a catalog to update their catalog. Thanks to Bob Schneider, Greg Acton and Keith Haney, 216 U.S. Parking Tokens have been published. This part of the plan was accomplished.

Another goal of the of the plan was to create a catalog for U.S. Parking Tokens on my computer and use tokencatalog.com as a reference source. I contacted Richard Greever who is the owner/Webmaster of tokencatalog.com and explained how the website would be used. Richard was extremely cooperative and modified his Website to conform with the way collectors of U.S. Parking Tokens manage their collections.

The Website needed some additional attention to make it a meaningful tool. AVA members Rik van Dam, Rocco DiGiacomo, Larry Dziubek, George Koch and Jim Tanzer came to the party and helped to improve the data base. Bob Nolan and Don Noe deserve special recognition. They have contributed an outrageous amount of time adding tokens and images, utilizing their knowledge to provide research to determine where tokens belong in the data base and while in the background kept me focused on the goal.

The combined team effort resulted in a net increase of almost 900 tokens being added to the data base. In addition, I found out the Website could be used for other purposes besides being a reference tool. There is a pull-down Tab that allows the collector to print out the data base. The data base becomes a book catalog.

There are over 4,200 tokens listed on 177 - 8 1/2"x 11" pages. I used Staples Business Services to add a back cover, a front cover and a clear protective sheet held in a spiral binder. They also printed United States Parking Tokens on the front cover. Total cost for my paper, my toner and Staples work was \$14.38. Anyone who collects U.S. Parking Tokens can make a book type catalog to manage their collection. Second goal completed.

## <u>Cape Girardeau – Jackson Interurban Ry. Co. – Missouri # 140-A</u> <u>By Curtis Judge #1566</u>


The Cape Girardeau-Jackson Interurban Railway Company was organized in 1905, by a group of Cape Girardeau capitalists. William H. Harrison was president, D.A. Glenn was vice-president, Rodney Whitelaw was secretary, and L.S. Joseph, treasurer. The first electric street car was operated in Cape Girardeau, Missouri on Dec. 7, 1905. The line ran from Good Hope street to the International Shoe Factory on a total of 4 miles of trackage. The original purpose was to build the tram line and then eventually extend it to Jackson, Illmo and Fornfelt, a plan which never materialized. Missouri Public Utilities Co. purchased the electric light and gas works in Cape Girardeau in 1922 as well as a controlling interest in the trolley company. On August 14, 1934 the Public Service Commission ended trolley service in the city.




The railway company used three tokens during its lifetime. The first, shown above, was minted by the Scoville Company in Connecticut in unknown quantity. The 19mm white metal example issued in 1905, is consimilar with the same die work on the obverse and reverse. No fare value is stated. The token is listed in the Atwood – Coffee transit catalog as Missouri 140-A with a valuation of \$25.00. A February 2022 eBay auction of a similar example realized \$20.51 USD. Two additional tokens were issued by the company in 1921 each specifying a fare value of ½ or full fare.



## North Texas Traction Company Fort Worth 1/2 Childs Fare Token –TEX-340-H - By Curtis Judge #1566

The Northern Texas Traction Co. was a subsidiary of Stone & Webster Engineering that operated the streetcar and interurban trolley lines in Ft. Worth, Texas. The NTTCo began with the purchase of the City Railway of Fort Worth and the Dallas & Oak Cliff Elevated Railway by George Bishop in 1900. Construction commenced on the interurban line from Ft. Worth to Dallas and service started in July 1, 1902 with a total of 35 miles of track. The power generating plant and repair shops were located in Handley, just east of Ft. Worth. Bishop sold the line to Stone and Webster in 1905. The company was sold in 1934 as a result of antitrust action brought by the government with interurban service being discontinued on Christmas eve in 1934. Streetcars continued until 1937 and then were shut down due to lack of ridership.

NTTCO issued numerous different tokens during it's operations. The ½ fare child's token pictured below is listed as Texas 340-H in the Atwood – Coffee transit token catalog. Even though dated 1920 the 23mm white metal bar design token was issued in 1925 in a quantity of 5000 pieces. Catalog valuation given is \$3.00. A July 2022 auction of this token realized \$5.61 + shipping with 4 bidders.

### **Discussion**

AVA member Dave Ferguson has gone through his collection and has compared the wording on each token to what is shown in the catalog. He has found several hundred discrepancies. Most of these discrepancies date back to catalogs prior to the 7<sup>th</sup> edition. Since it required a considerable amount of Fare Box space to document all of these discrepancies, I have discussed them over a number of issues. Most of the corrections involve missing or extraneous punctuation marks, misspelled words, or 1 mm size changes.

In this Fare Box, I am listing changes for fantasies, presentation pieces, and transportation related tokens.

In consideration of all the recent changes, a new hard copied version of the catalog (A-C 8) will be printed in early 2023.

2 additional Original Stage Line tokens CA 997 O and P appeared in an eBay auction from an estate sale. These are similar to CA 997 E through K but with different destinations.

The Carlisle KY token KY 100 G is similar to KY 100 B and C except that it is for Gate #3. The example of KY 100 G that Curtis showed me was pierced. Since no other C. & S.T.P. tokens were pierced, I am assuming for now that the hole was created by a third party.

A few months ago, the Princeton MO depotel was sold on eBay for \$544.55. Tom Lieuallen, the owner of the hack line, was born in 1869, died in 1926 and is buried in Princeton Cemetery. Princeton, located 117 miles northeast of Kansas City, was situated on the Chicago to Kansas City line of the Rock Island Railroad. Princeton currently has a population of a little over 1,000. At its peak between 1900 and 1920, the population was 1,500. Calamity Jane, the famed frontierswoman and admirer of Wild Bill Hickok, was born in Princeton.

Downsville WI is a tiny town west of Eau Claire. The town holds an annual festival every August. A kids tractor pull is part of the festivities and I presume that the token has some connection to that.

Miscellaneous token 145 B is just like 145 A except that it has a different mint mark.

### West Riding Automobile Co. Ltd. – Celluloid 1-D fare token England 800-BB - By Curtis Judge #1566

The West Riding Automobile Company was formed as a subsidiary of the Yorkshire (West Riding) Electric Tramways Company, which was founded in 1904 to operate electric tramway services in the area. However, by the 1920s, there was a decline in the use of tramways, and the West Riding .Automobile Company was formed to operate bus services from its bases in Wakefield and Castleford. Twenty-two Bristol 4-ton vehicles were purchased at a cost of £30,000, and services began in April 1922. The company purchased its rival J Bullock & Sons of Featherstone in 1950, doubling the size of its fleet. By the mid-1950s, the company was the largest British operator to be in private hands. In1967 it was acquired by the Transport Holding Company and became part of the National Bus Company on 1 January 1969.

West Riding issued a total of three tokens during it's operations. All three are celluloid, sized at 23mm with a 1990 Smith's catalog valuations of \$0.40. The light blue example shown below is listed as England 800-BB. Recent 2022 on line sales show prices in the \$1-3.00 range depending on condition. There is also a 1/2D in green (BA) and a 1D in very light blue (BC).

PARCOA (GATE) Tokens are a substantial part of any collection of U.S. Parking Tokens. The manufacture used various dies to produce the reverse side of the token with the words PARCOA and TOKEN along with an image of their parking gate. The position, with each other, of these three items identifies which of the dies where used for each token. Each die is given a capital letter in a parenthesis [Example: REV (A). REV (B) etc.].

The 1st Parking Token Catalog identified "four distinguishable varieties of the standard types of PARCOA (gate) Token reverses with photographs." "The four reverses" were differentiated by the left-handed and right-handed side of the gate unit alignment with the letters in both the letters in both the words PARCOA and TOKEN.

The 2nd Parking Token Catalog identified "12 distinguishable varieties of the standard types of PARCOA (gate) Token reverses with photographs. The 12 reverses were again differentiated by the left-handed and right-handed side of the gate unit alignment with the letters in both the words PARCOA and TOKEN.

The 3rd and 4th Parking Token Catalogs contain 19 photographs of the major varieties. In addition, a table with columns labeled "PARCOA" Distance inside...mm and "Token" Distance inside...mm to identify the various varieties. A note is posted: "The table following should provide a means for distinguishing the types."

The 5th and 6th Parking Token Catalog contained 19 photographs of the major varieties. In addition, a table with columns labeled "PARCOA" Distance P--A...mm and "TOKEN" Distance T--N...mm to identify the various varieties. The note is again posted: "The table following should provide a means for distinguishing the types".

The 7th Parking Token Catalog does not contain any photographs of the major varieties of the PARCOA Reverses. A table is again shown with columns "PARCOA" Distance P--A...mm and "TOKEN" Distance T--N... mm.

I am not aware why the photographs were eliminated from the catalog. Perhaps it was because the photographs appearing in the other recent catalogs were very poor and impossible to use. Using photographs when cataloging coins is standard and can be used for tokens also. AVA member Rik van Dam has made good photographs available on his website; www.parkingtokens.com -TOKENS – USA. If anyone does not have access to the internet, please contact me and I will send you a copy of the photographs.



### CORRECTIONS TO A-C 4 Volume 2

(reported by Steve Baron)
Page 533 Fort Worth 340 E Baptist Seminary Street Railway The statement that the Street Railway was really a bus line is incorrect. The service was indeed a street railway operated with a Fairbanks-Morse gasoline motor car which ran on tracks.

The November 1965 Fare Box page 170 contains a discussion of this token. AVA member Marie Johnson wrote a letter to the Seminary and received a response from a professor there. The professor was aware that the Seminary at one time provided connecting service to the Fort Worth street railway system and assumed incorrectly that the service was a bus. The Baptist Seminary Street Railway opened in 1912 and was taken over by the Fort Worth streetcar system in 1923.

### Discussion

Leesville LA 520 A mentions both Pine Bluff and Camp Polk. Camp Polk now Fort Polk is near Leesville LA but Pine Bluff is in Arkansas so it seems rather peculiar that both are mentioned on the same token. The explanation is that Jimmy Owens owned two bus services, one serving Camp Polk and the other operating between Pine Bluff AR and the Pine Bluff Arsenal. The same token was used in both places.

Metairie LA 600 B is the same as LA 600 A except it is not plated. As was the case for LA 810 J and K below, the plated token might have been used for promotions of some sort while the non plated token was for everyday use.

The Norco Ferry token was discussed in the May 2022 Fare Box and classified as Transportation Related. Leonard Gresens feels it should be considered a regular issue and I agree.

Shreveport LA 810 K is the same as LA 810 J except that is WM plated. Leonard stated that he frequently went to the Crystal Palace as a teenager and remembers the WM plated tokens being used for package deals.

The Albany Oregon carousel has issued a new token with a humorous depiction of a cat driving an automobile.

The Salem Carousel issued a new token with a carousel cow but no reference to the location where it was issued.

The Sisseton-Wahpeton Sioux Tribe Department of Transportation recently initiated transit service on the Lake Traverse Reservation and has issued two plastic tokens.

### Car Wash Convention Report

Current as of 30 July 2022

Since the 2019 convention we have added 994 new listings to the car wash catalog. As you can see from the attached chart we are over 13,238 total car wash listings from 48 countries. I also have 100's of other tokens waiting to be cataloged and researched. International listings and interest is growing rapidly due to the Facebook group and participating in other similar regional and international groups.

### Special Points of Interest

I am in the works of converting the car wash catalog into a PDF format so it can be offered online to members. I want it to be in a similar format as the current Transportation catalog. I like the idea of offering it free to members and updating it every 4-5 years. I welcome words of wisdom and advice from anybody with knowledge of PDF or similar programs. If you know anybody with knowledge of how to convert my catalog into a similar format as the online transportation catalog, I would welcome help. My knowledge and computer skills are greatly lacking but I am motivated.

2. I wish to thank Catalin Lulian of Brasov, Romania. Catalin has a job that requires him to travel all over Romania installing and repairing the meters at various car washes. The locations provide him free tokens to test their meters and he has accumulated a nice assortment. His help has increased the listing for Romania from 3 to 77 with the promise of more to come. His is working on connecting me with others that do the same job in neighboring countries.

3. As always, 100% of the Car Wash Token Catalog is listed on tokencatalog.com thanks to Richard Greever and the National Token Collectors Association. Richard volunteered (h)is time an skills to upload the car wash catalog to his site. Access to a visual catalog has greatly increased the number of new tokens being reported. This increase exposure has also had a profound effect on the number of previously unidentified tokens being attributed by collectors specializing in other types of tokens outside of our organization as well as drawing attention to the AVA. I have noticed that, of the individuals that I have contact with, approximately 75-80% of individuals that express an interest in car wash and transit tokens are from foreign locations.

4. My Facebook Group called "Car Wash Tokens" has been running for a few years now. The group currently has 290 members from more than a three dozen different nations. This Facebook group is helping expand the interest of collecting world car wash tokens. It should be noted that most of these individuals are not members of the AVA but I believe they can be with proper motivation. By not expanding into FACEBOOK we (the AVA) are missing out on 100's of new potential members. One day I hope to see an AVA Facebook group in which all 3 groups (transit, parking and car wash) can be merged into on site and enjoyed while trying to encourage new members to join in. It does appear that there are some ongoing efforts to do just that, and I am excited at the potential.

### MINUTES OF THE EXECUTIVE BOARD MEETING Submitted by Leonard Gresens, Recording Secretary

The 71<sup>st</sup> annual Executive Board Meeting of the AVA was called to order by President Chris Donovan at the Hilton Garden Inn, Ames, IA on Thursday August 4, 2022. Members in attendance were, Chris Donovan (President), Fred Sader (Vice President), Leonard Gresens (Recording Secretary), Joel Reznick (Treasurer), Rich Mallicote (Past President and Convention Chairman), Bob Schneider (Fare Box Editor) and Keith Haney (Curator). Visitors attending included Ken & Chris Smith, Joe Adams, Randy Glucksman, Kris Olson.

The 2020 Executive Board meeting minutes were read. With the exception of RS Leonard Gresens
mispronouncing Rich Mallicote's name, no changes were made. Bob Schneider made the motion
to accept the minutes as read with Keith Haney seconding the motion. The motion passed
unanimously.

#### **OLD BUSINESS:**

- The discussion from last year concerning Parking Tokens was the first order of old business. Chris indicated he had sent a letter to Joe Pernicano. Joe has moved to Florida and is living with his daughter. The people Chris talked to has made it clear that Joe is unreachable and being 93 is probably not attending to the Parking Token catalog. Last year Bill Brenner has been working on updating and cataloging new finds and it is the opinion of the Board to move forward with naming Bill as the editor for the Parking Token catalog. Rik Van Dam will continue to catalog on the foreign token side.
- Rich was called upon to update us on the By-Law changes. The By -Law committee consisted of Rich, Bob, Chris and Joel R. The main concerns are:

  - Correct error and update application information in Article III, Section 4
  - Update expenses information in Article III, Section 6
  - Change office in Article III, Section 7, 8 and 9 and Article V, Section 1 from Secretary to Corresponding Secretary
  - Split duties of Secretary to Recording Secretary and Corresponding Secretary in Article V,
     Section 4
  - Clarify definition of investments in Article V, Section 5
  - Add new Executive Board members in Article VI, Section 1
  - o Rewrite Past President membership in Article VI, Section 6

- Change person receiving election nomination to Election Committee Chairman
- Standardize Article and Section formats

This will be first presented on Friday at the first Business Meeting of the convention, before the bourse. Anyone wanting a copy of the By-Laws, Rich had handouts and made them available. The vote will take place on Sunday at the Membership meeting.

- A new procedure on how the Audit Committee will conduct the Treasurers Report audit. Chris will appoint the three members and they will meet before Sunday's meeting and review the report. This will eliminate the meeting taking a break and having the committee review the report and then reporting. Chris appointed Kris Olson, Allen Dean and Kenton "Red" Te Lindert with the task this year. They will report on Sunday. While on the subject of the Treasurer, Joel Reznick indicated we may want to look at finding a new Treasurer in the near future.
- Joel Bernstein was not present at this years Convention. As was indicated in an email sent out
  earlier, Joel's wife Judy had surgery and was recuperating at home. The procedure was only a few
  weeks earlier and travel at this time would not have been possible. A discussion of the procedure
  was talked about, but we will not record the discussion due to HIPAA laws.
- Since Joel was not present to report on New Issue Listings, Rich took over and indicated an 8<sup>th</sup> edition of the Catalog is planned for 2023. It will be available in both bound copies and PDF format. With the number of changes that are appearing in the Fare Box, and the 7<sup>th</sup> addition is now seven years old, it would only make sense to go forward with the new addition. The addition will include any changes and additions through December 2022. No motion is necessary, Rich has the authority to go forward.
- Sue Ellen Miller has resigned from the Corresponding Secretary position. Randy Glucksman has stepped up to the position. A discussion with how new applications will be handled brought much talk on the procedure. In the end the three individuals involved will work out the details.
- The New Issue Service report was given by Fred Sader. The report is as followed:

NIS had only the Convention Token and one additional shipment after the 2021 Convention. The lingering effects of the Pandemic keep many companies from investing in tokens or considering them. I was able to get some tokens out this year thanks to a discovery of a duplicate set of tokens made for St. Joseph, Michigan's Silver Beach Carousel. These tokens were made for special events a number of years (ago) and they had enough supply for most years to make a NIS shipment. The Carousel for Missoula also had three tokens last year. It has been a staple for years. Other systems are starting to have the tokens we have cherished, come back, Unfortunately Transit systems are still fighting the economic issues that affect us all and are making few available in the numbers we need.

The yearly date costs were, Shipment # 21-02, \$1,760.00 and Shipment #22-01, \$1,752.30 for a total of \$3,512.30.

- The Fare Box continues to grow, although membership is down. Bob talked about the changes taking place with the website and how it is a continued work in progress. He has taken over most of the editing of the website. He continues to ask for articles for The Fare Box, saying he isn't a writer. He made the suggestion about advertising in a few publications to get more exposure. A discussion about cost and having a website was brought up. It was suggested that to possibly attract younger collectors, the need for a website is essential.
- Rich had handed out earlier this year's Convention brochure with the weekend's agenda. A change
  in the directions to the train station was inserted due to road closures in Boone for a Festival. He
  thanked everyone for coming. He made mention he is 95% sure that next year's Convention would
  be held in Cheyenne, Wyoming. More to follow.
- . The Curator's report for 2022 was given by Keith H. It is as follows:

#### Fare Box Report

- June 2022 had 237 members receiving the FB by email. Our cost is labor only, about 2 hours to generate the distribution file and actually send the emails. The time to prepare the print copy file, print the labels, attach labels and stamps, and stuff and seal envelopes plus 2 trips to the post office is about 6 hours for 125 print copies. We currently have 15 members receiving both print and email for only the price of print copy per month. Print is costing \$2 per copy. Our total current membership is 312 actives. We lost 36 members this last renewal period.
- Email cost \$10 dollars for one year or \$40 for five years. Print is \$25 for one year, \$48 for two, or \$69 for 3 years. The last time we really calculated our costs, we budgeted \$6.00 per year for outside costs. Including the certificates and postage for the recognitions plus office expenses. The last 12 months Fare Boxes had an annual US cost of \$27.25. This puts us under cost by an average of \$3.25. Canada dues are \$30 per year, or \$3.75 less than cost, but only affects one member.
- Then there are 32 Life members receiving print copy who do not pay any dues. Their purchase of Life membership absolved them of future dues, plus our gifting Life onto those who reach 50 years provides no Fare box income. All production costs are reimbursed from general funds, but the total costs are still there.
- Last year we knew we were borderline on raising dues, and this year we are there. The loss of membership renewals only exasperates the situation. As an alternative, with our treasury we can continue to absorb the costs as we did last year. Postage goes up this month to 60 cents per first ounce. I do not yet know if the second ounce (our standard copy weight) will go up. We have paid to the Coffee fund for 10 years, so our obligation and donations have ceased. The board may elect to continue.

#### Recognitions

We have eight 10-year engraved medal recipients, seven 25-year certificate recipients,
 and 7 framed certificate 50-year recipients. Those last seven will be converted to Life

(non-dues-paying) memberships. Each also receives a thank you letter signed by the President of the AVA. A listing of their names appears in the secretary Fare Box reports.

- Our efforts last year to find a printer for the 50-year certificates resulted in their sending me about a half-ream of special paper, and my computer printer does an absolutely accurate copy. Problem solved. Cost \$8,30.

### <u>Pavonia Horse Rail Road Company – Employee Token</u>

### Atwood NJ 390-A By Curtis Judge # 1566

The Pavonia Horse Railroad was chartered on April 4, 1867 and was based in the Pavonia section of Jersey City, New Jersey. The line was a feeder operation for the Pennsylvania Railroad running from the ferry docks in Pavonia to Monmouth Street in Jersey City. The line was profitable for the owners and was bought out by the North Hudson County Railway Company in 1891 and then electrified in 1893.

The company issued four tokens during its operations. The 22mm token shown below is listed in the Atwood-Coffee Transit catalog as NJ 390-A. It was struck in white metal and good for one employee fare on the line. Catalog valuation is \$240.00, this example brought \$271.85 with 4 bidders in a February 2022 eBay auction. The company also issued a 23mm carmine celluloid ½ fare, a blue celluloid employee and a 22mm holed white metal full fare token. All four are seldom seen and bring premium prices if in good condition.

Images of the rolling stock could not be located after extensive multi category search. If any member has additional information on this short lived line, please forward it to the writer.



### A Trip to WAWA by Randy Glucksman

On August 21, 2022, rail service was restored to Wawa, one station west of Elwyn, on what was the West Chester Branch. Three intermediate stations (Williamson School, Glen Riddle and Lenni) were not included. Wawa was served by the Pennsylvania Railroad, then Penn-Central, and Conrail. With Conrail's exit from commuter operations in January 1983, SEPTA later designated it as the R3 Media/Elwyn Line. "R" designations were eliminated by SEPTA as of July 25, 2010. The Line was just renamed Media/Wawa. Service between Wawa and West Chester ended on September 19, 1986.

Due to other plans earlier that week I chose to take this trip on Thursday, August 25 and emailed a number of friends asking if they were interested. Ultimately we were five, three from New York and two others; one who lived in the Philadelphia area, the other visiting Philadelphia.

Checking the Pascack Valley and Northeast Corridor timetables, I decided that just in case of any delays, I should just take the first PVL train, #1602, which departed from Nanuet at 5:15 AM. Arrival at Secaucus Jct. was on time, but even though the connecting train, #3702 was a few minutes late, I would have plenty of time at NY Penn.

One friend and I purchased \$26 tickets on Amtrak Train #79, The Carolinian, which departed NY Penn at 7:25 AM. My SEPTA Senior Key Card had expired this past March, and although all cards were extended for one more year, I decided to schedule an appointment to get a new one.

When this program was new it was a nightmare getting one in terms of how long it took once you were at the location where it was taking place. However this time with a scheduled arrival at 30th St. Station at 8:48 AM, I chose a 9:10 AM appointment and the whole process took about 15 minutes. By that time all five of use were ready to go to Wawa and we walked across the street to the Jefferson station. My new card, which worked immediately, is good for four years.

Two of us decided to ride the Manyunk/Norristown Line and return on the Norristown High Speed Line to 69th St. Upon arrival at 69th St. we walked downstairs to the Market-Frankford Line, tapped our Key Cards and rode to 30th St. We then walked across the street to the 30th Street station, home to Amtrak and SEPTA.

When I planned the trip I did not know what train I would ride back to New York, and had no specific time that I had to be home, so SEPTA to Trenton and NJ Transit would work fine. My friend wound up having an evening event and rode on Amtrak.



My eastbound trip aboard Train #9753 departed from 30th St. a few minutes after its scheduled 3:16 PM time. With a scheduled arrival in Trenton of 4:11 PM, there were a few problems en route which diminished my hopes of riding Train #3896, the 4:12 PM departure. First there was an air-conditioning problem in the first car which required some maintenance and later a customer with a child in a stroller who wanted to get off at Eddington, a Flag Stop, but did not know that she needed to be in the first car, not the second car. Additionally the train had to wait for two westbound's so that it could cross the interlocking plant to get to Track 5 so it be ready for a direct lineup to Center City. The next scheduled train would be #3864, the 4:40 PM departure.

After getting off the train in Trenton I looked at the screens listing the departures and saw that Train #3896 was "delayed." This was due to the earlier Portal Bridge problems. I walked quickly up, across and down to the other platform and lo and behold after a few minutes the equipment for this train arrived. We departed at 4:24 PM and generally followed its normal stops.

The train arrived at Secaucus Jct. on Track 2 where there are few staircases to the upper level when compared to Tracks A and B at 5:38 PM. This left me under five minutes to get to the escalator to reach the upper level, and get through the fare gates and then walk down to the lower platform and ride the escalator to Track H. As I was nearing the platform, Train #1629, the afternoon Pascack Valley MNR Express was arriving. We arrived at Nanuet ON TIME.

It was a very enjoyable but long and successful day, made better by the friends who joined me.

### The Tuscaloosa Trolley Token - Alabama 800-G - By Curtis Judge # 1566

The Tuscaloosa County Parking and Transit Authority was set up by an act of the Alabama Legislature in 1971. The Tuscaloosa Transit Authority serves the city of Tuscaloosa and also operates the trolleys between the student entertainment districts downtown and The Strip and game day shuttle buses for Alabama football games. The company employs 11 full time Fixed Route drivers, 5 Demand Response drivers, 1 driver/floater, 3 Mechanics, and several part-time employees. The move to Trolley Illusion buses came out of a study started in 1998 showing that smaller more economical buses were needed. The trolley is an illusion, it is an El Dorado Transmark RE bus, painted to look like a trolley.

TTA issued a 29mm aluminum token on 10-23-2000 which is used for one fare on the regular bus routes. Listed as Alabama 800-G in the Atwood-Coffee transit catalog mintage is not known. The tokens were struck by the Roger Williams Mint using a stock RWM eagle reverse die and a custom obverse die. Catalog valuation is given as \$1.00 with recent eBay sales in the range of \$2-3.00. Fares are Adult - \$1.00, Child - \$0.50, system transfer \$0.20, On Demand Paratransit \$2.00. The system operates from 5AM to 6PM Monday through Friday and during football games.



## Wheeling Traction System Wheeling, WVa 1929 Zone Fare Token By C. Judge

The Wheeling Traction Company has played an important part in advancing Wheeling, West Virginia and the Ohio Valley. It's predecessor lines progressed from the old-time horse car mode of transportation to an extensive city and interurban electric railway system. Wheeling was the third city in the United States to have an electrically operated trolley system. Several smaller railway companies were combined by local interests to form the Wheeling Traction Company in 1899. The WTCo expanded and eventually served a number of WVA and Ohio cities. In 1912 the stock of the Wheeling Traction Company was taken over by the West Penn Railways Company of Pittsburgh but continued to operate under the name WTCo. The system eventually operated 61 trolleys over 46 miles of track and 62 busses over 87 miles of route. Streetcars were abandoned in Wheeling on April 14, 1948.

The Wheeling Traction Company only issued a single zone fare token in 1929 relying on cash fares during most of its operating history. The token is listed as Wheeling 890-Q in the Atwood Coffee transit catalog with a given valuation of \$1.00. The brass 20mm token was minted in unknown quantity using a triangular cut out design. An example of this token sold in June of 2022 on the eBay site realizing \$15.00 after receiving 8 bids.



This pinback badge on the left was used to identify company employees and the second image is a badge worn by the conductors on their hats.



This photo shows one of the early city car trolleys used by Wheeling. The first electric cars operated in Wheeling were known as the Vanderpool type. The motor was in the front cab and was geared with a sprocket chain running from the motor to a sprocket wheel on the axle of the car. These cars could only be operated in one direction and it was necessary to have turntables or a "Y" at any point where it was necessary to turn the car. Power was conveyed to the car with two overhead trolley wires, as no return was used through the rail.

### <u>Peoples Line Steam Ship Token – Dual Category – Civil War and Transit</u> By Curtis Judge #1566


People's Line Passenger Steamships was based in New York City and operated from 1861 to 1865. These tokens served as both advertisements and time tables. People's Line Steamboats, The Dean Richmond and The Drew, ran between New York and Albany daily, on the Hudson River. They worked in conjunction with the New York Central Railroad. They left Pier 16, N.R., between Cortlandt and Liberty Streets at 6 P.M. They arrived in Albany in time to connect with morning trains for east, west, and northern destinations on the railroad. They left Albany after arrivals of trains, at 71/2 P.M. Baggage could be checked to and from all stations of New York Central Railroad and principal western cities.

The beautiful example shown below is cataloged as a civil war token in Fuld's reference as NY-630-BD-1a with a R-2 rarity being assigned. The token is also listed in the Atwood-Coffee transit catalog as Timetable-G with a \$15.00 valuation. Multiple die varieties exist for the 19mm bronze token. This example is in uncirculated condition. An August 2022 eBay auction of this token realized \$129.50 receiving 23 bids.





The silver-toned Texas Cowboy, L.L. Shaw, known as "Texas Red," and his guitar, is the big special added attraction at the Salmon Creek Road House tonight.

Shaw was for five months with the Hoot Gibson company at Hollywood, Cal. He enter-tained for six weeks at Yosemite National Park in California, and was engaged for six weeks at the Grand Canyon National Park in Arizona.

## Wrangell Sentinel, April 2, 1937. *GOATS BY PLANE*


Anchorage - Local aviators have branched out into animal air transport here following the lead of Star Airways which delivered the second consignment of six reindeer from Naknek last Saturday to be used here by a movie producer.

Shortly after the reindeer were landed, Pilot Bert Ruoff left with several live goats con-signed to "Texas Red" Shaw on the Skwentna River. Shaw like goat meat while engaged in trapping.

## Kusko Times, McGrath, October 22, 1937 New Trading Post Established.

Sleetmute is getting to be quite a little village. Nick Mellick will soon have his new up-to-date store building finished. Across from Nick's place George Clyde and his father-in-law Bill Liske have just established a small trading post which they hope to see grow. George has been employed as a radio operator at Bear Creek for the past several seasons. Across from Clyde, two miles below Mellick, L.L. "Red" Shaw has a new trading post under construction. Shaw is a new arrival from the other side. Previous to coming here, Shaw worked for Chauncey Peterson of Anchorage, driving taxi and running a bus between Anchorage and Palmer. The new trader spent one sea-son with the Alaska Guides and is quite familiar with fur, having put in a few seasons trapping on the Squintna River.

Remember Chauncy Peterson? He owned the Pan-handle Saloon

### Kodiak Mirror, May 7, 1949. Reflections in the Mirror 8 years ago – 1941

The Kodiak Transit Co., owned by Bill Smith and Basil O'Neil, bought the interest and equipment of the Brown Bear Bus Line, owned by L.L. Shaw. Both operated between the base and the town.

#### Kodiak Mirror, May 8, 1943.

L.L. "Red" Shaw, former bus line operator of the Brown Bear Bus line in this city, arrived by plane this week on a short business trip. Shaw has been working at Whittier, and recently moved a boatload of cargo to Seward.



#### Kodiak Mirror, May 15, 1943.

Linnie L. "Red" Shaw, former bus line operator here left this week for Anchorage after a brief visit. Shaw was fined \$250 in federal court at

Anchorage May 4 when he pleaded guilty to il-licit sales of liquor at Whittier. Shaw was charged with selling liquor from his boat, the Patricia.

There appears to have been a nasty divorce between L.L. "Red" Shaw and his wife Maxine in 1941. They were granted alternate custody of their son in the divorce. In 1944, Mr. Shaw took is son to Arizona and did not turn him over to his mother at the appro-priate time. The former Mrs. Shaw (now Mrs. Branham - see below) filed legal charges in Arizona. These charges were dismissed. Nothing further is reported.

#### Kodiak Mirror, June 14, 1945.

A coming picture article in Look magazine about post-war possibilities in the Anchorage area will be of special interest to Kodiak people, as the couple chosen to be portrayed in the lay-out is Lt. "Bud" Branham, well-known while stationed here, and his wife Maxine, a hostess for Alaska Air-lines, the former Mrs. L.L. Shaw, who lived in Kodiak for some time.

As a result of some investigating, Paul Fouts of Seattle has learned that the Brown Bear tokens of Kodiak, Alaska, are being used in a local night club up there as hat checks. The tokens have had a hole punched through them, and various num-bers have been counterstamped on them. Once quite rare, a few more of these tokens turned up in recent years. But whoever had the supply of them up in Alaska has now found a more practical use for them. They were first used as hat checks about 1945, so even the altered ones may now be gone.



Norwood, Minnesota is located approximately 40 miles west of Minneapolis and was located on two railroads: the Milwaukee Road's Twin Cities to Aberdeen SD line and the Minneapolis & St. Louis Railroad's Twin Cities to Aberdeen SD line. In more recent times, the town of Norwood merged with the nearby town of Young America and is now called Norwood Young America.

The Effertz Hotel was named for Peter Hubert Effertz (1845-1926) who built the hotel in 1878. Effertz served in the Minnesota House of Representatives from 1907 to 1908.

A reference to the Effertz Hotel appeared in the New Ulm Review of July 29, 1885. The hotel was damaged in a fire which destroyed several neighboring businesses. A photo of the hotel, which was a frame two story structure, can be found on the Norwood Young America website.

KS 820 A has been listed as bronze for the last few catalogs. Rich Mallicote feels it looks like brass and my example is definitely brass not bronze so I agree. If someone has a bronze example, please let me know.

In the world of token collecting, tokens are usually cataloged by listing them to where they are or were used. When the exact location is unknown, they are labeled "unattributed" and are called "maverick tokens". Parking Tokens are slightly different. In the 1<sup>st</sup> Edition of the Catalog of Parking Tokens of the World, Duane Feisel provided definitions of various categories that were adapted from definitions set forth by the AVA. Tokens that are "unattributed" are filed in the unknown (PTUN) category. There are tokens that have the exact location on the token where it was used. However, in the book catalog they were filed in one of the various categories. A list of the 7 categories with examples was published in the November 2021 FARE BOX.

As a result of many collectors using tokencatalog.com not being AVA members and not being exposed to the Feisel Catalogs, tokens were attributed to the location shown on the token. However, if a catalog is printed from the PDF file in tokencatalog.com, all the tokens in the various categories are found in each group. Examples: PSTM 3001-AE, N, R, and T are found in the Maryland file but will be with all the other PSTM tokens if you print a PDF file. The files in tokencatalog.com will contain the County along with the State and City location where the token is or was used.

Another example: DE 3900-K was a PTMS 3070-O stamped (incused) Y.M.C.A. The token was unlisted using the 29<sup>th</sup> supplement of the 7<sup>th</sup> Edition of the Parking Token Book Catalog. Tokencatalog.com has both posted. One in DE stamped with Y.M.C.A. (incused) and one in PSTM. If it is documented where a PTMS token was used to facilitate parking a vehicle, why not show it in both locations? Collectors are encouraged to submit their view (opinion).

One of the reasons token collecting is so enjoyable is, the collector can decide what tokens to collect. Recently a collector contacted me about having a Parking Token with an error. Should it be added to the catalog and if it is added, where should it be posted? A token with an error is not the same as a variety token. Varieties are made on purpose by using a different die or material, etc. Coins having an error is a different thing. There are collectors who collect only coin errors. There is a separate section in the "Classic Edition of the Red Book" that lists some of the error coins. Currently there is no place to list error tokens in a Parking Token Catalog. Should a new 8<sup>th</sup> category (PTER) be established in the non-local list to provide a home for error parking tokens? Collectors are encouraged to submit their view (opinion).

This article is called NEWS AND VIEWS for a reason. Remember, a view (opinion) is like a nose. Everyone has one. Looking forward to hearing from Parking Token Collectors about these two issues.



## Ashland Light, Power and St. Ry. Co. - Wisconsin 40-B By Curtis Judge

The Ashland Street Railway was established in 1887, with the first horse-drawn cars running on November 2, 1887. In 1892, the Ashland Lighting Company merged with the Street Railway to form the Ashland, Light, Power & Street Railway. Modifications to the track and running of the overhead supply electric wires were performed. The first electrified street car was reported in the local paper as "having shot out of the barn" in late January 1893. The company was purchased in 1922 by the Lake Superior District Power Company. The last street car ran in Ashland during September of 1933; after which the Ashland Bus Company ran busses in the city.

The Ashland Power, Light and Street Railway Company issued two different tokens during its operations, a ½ fare child's token and a full fare token. The full fare token listed as Wisconsin 40-B in the Atwood-Coffee catalog is shown below. It is 16mm in diameter, struck on white metal blanks with an "A" cutout. Mintage is unknown and the listing was given a \$3.00 valuation. A recent eBay auction of this example in September of 2022 ended with a sale price of \$12.00.

## Kahului Railroad Co. – Maui Hawaii - One Fare Token #330-A by Curtis Judge

The Kahului Railroad (KRR) was a common carrier railway company in Hawaii. It operated on a 3 ft (914 mm) narrow gauge track 15 miles (24 km) in length running from Wailuku to Kuiaha on the north coast of the island of Maui. After the US government allowed sugar to be exported duty-free in 1876, the sugar industry on Maui experienced a strong upswing. Thomas H. Hobron, saw the need to transport the sugar quickly to the ports. On 17 July, 1879, he opened a railway line from Wailuku to the harbor in Kahului under the name Kahului and Wailuku Railroad. The first passenger train ran on 29 July 1879. Scheduled mixed freight / passenger trains operated from Tuesday to Friday. From 1 July 1881, rail operations operated under the name Kahului Railroad. The railway was the last public railway in the state of Hawaii running a total of 87 years. KRR was decommissioned on 22 May, 1966. The tracks and some vehicles were used for the construction of the Lahaina, Kaanapali and Pacific Railroad, a tourist train on the western side of the island.

Kahului Railroad issued two different white metal passenger fare tokens during it's operation. Both are similar in die work differing only in size, 16mm and 23mm. The 23mm example shown below is listed as Hawaii 330-A in Atwood's transit catalog, the 16mm is listed as 330-B. This token is the more common variety with 30,000 examples being struck in 1935. Catalog valuation on 330-A is given as \$7.00 but is optimistic, this example failed to get a bid in three auctions listing it with a starting price of \$10.00. Auction results for the smaller 16mm token could not be located.



It was taken over by an American company, reorganized in Maine (1926) and operated the system until finally declaring bankruptcy in 1950.

It's interesting that the company name appears on the token in English, but its value is in Spanish.

# <u>The Commuters Friend – A Spring Loaded Pocket Token Holder</u> By Curtis Judge

Many of the transit agencies sold tokens in bulk at a discount for a regular commuter's usage. The problem arose of where to store your excess tokens, no one wants to carry a pocket full of change and spare tokens. Some enterprising individual invented the spring loaded pocket token holder. These devices usually held 12 tokens of 16-17mm size for more than a week's worth of rides. Tokens were pushed out the side opening with the thumb from the easily carried holder. Made from die cut machine stamped steel the holders were some times chrome plated. Advertisements were commonly stamped on the bottom. Pricing runs from \$5.00 to \$25-30.00 depending on condition, the advertisement company and location on the bottom.

# <u>Jamaica Waggonette & Express Co Ltd – Smiths Jamaica 420-D</u> C. Judge

The Jamaica Waggonette & Express Co. Ltd. was founded in the early 1880's and based in Kingston, Jamaica. Its main office was located at 5 North Street in Kingston. The company offered wagons for small express freight movement, single and double buggies, carriages and waggonettes for public carriage and taxi services. The public carriage services ran on a set schedule with units for hire for special occasion transport. The company, all rolling stock, horse barns and property were offered for sale on January 11,1890. No history was found after that date, it is not known if the company was sold or was dissolved in a bankruptcy.

The company issued one token (two die varieties) an example of which is pictured below. Date of issuance and quantity produced are not known. The token is quite rare and seldom seen. The piece measures 17mm X 22mm, is oval shaped and was produced from a dark blue hard rubber sometimes called vulcanite. The token is very thick – see side image – compared to most era pieces. The token is cataloged in several references – Lyal #132, Prid. #141, Rohers #1212 and Smith's 1990 reference as #480-D. All list the token as extremely rare R8 or R9. One example in lesser condition realized 750 GBP in Noonan's T-16 auction on October 2019. This example sold on eBay – November 2022 - at a best offer price against a starting price of \$799.99 plus shipping.


# <u>Lexington City Railway Company - Horsecar Token – Lexington KY 480-A.</u>



Public transportation in Lexington, KY began back in 1874 with omnibuses, oversized horse-drawn stagecoaches. These omnibuses were operated by a private company called the Lexington City Railway Company. The name was later changed to the Lexington Street Railway Company to avoid confusion with the steam railroads. The company operated until 1890 when it's assets were purchased by the Kentucky Traction and Terminal Company who electrified the system and converted to streetcars.

The tokens showing horse drawn streetcars or omnibuses are some of the most sought after transit items. These tokens were very early issues and not commonly found. LCRCo only issued a single token cataloged as Kentucky 480-A in the Atwood Coffee transit catalog, an example is shown below. The token is octagonal, 26mm across the flats being struck in a light brass alloy in unknown quantity. Catalog valuation is given as \$200. Two pieces have recently shown up on eBay, the first sold at a \$250 BIN price in August of 2022. The second is currently listed (11-22) with a starting price of \$399 and has not sold through three auction cycles.
