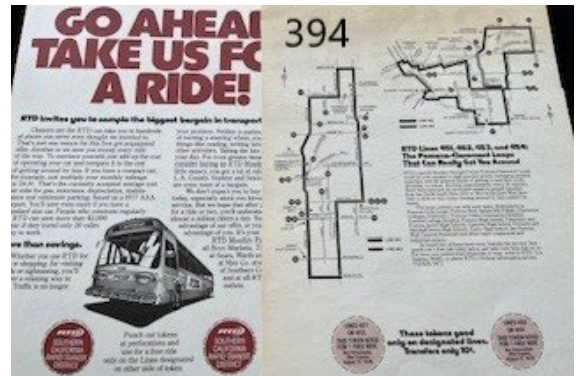
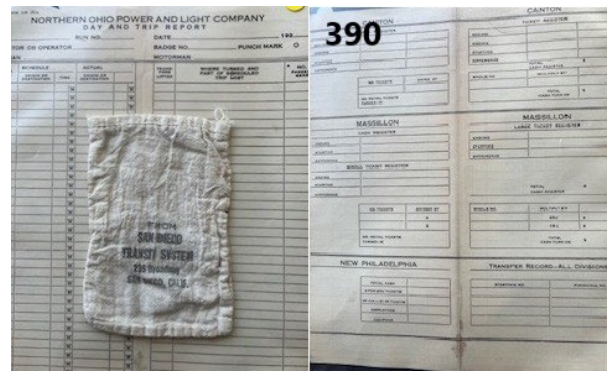
Follow Up to "What will happen to your collection?"

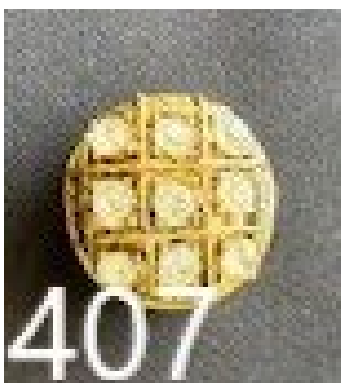
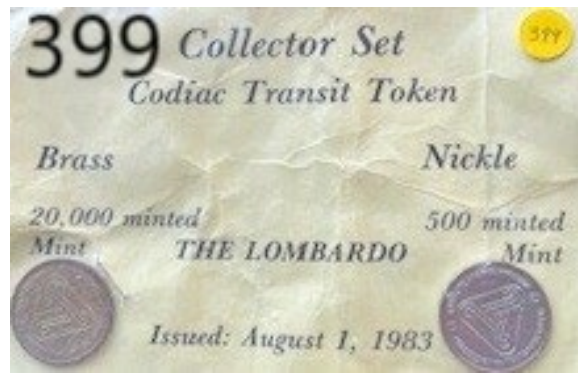
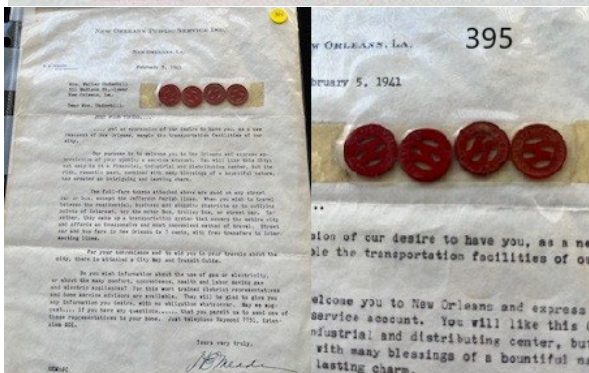

East London Municipal Ferry 1880 – South Africa #320-FA by: Curtis Judge

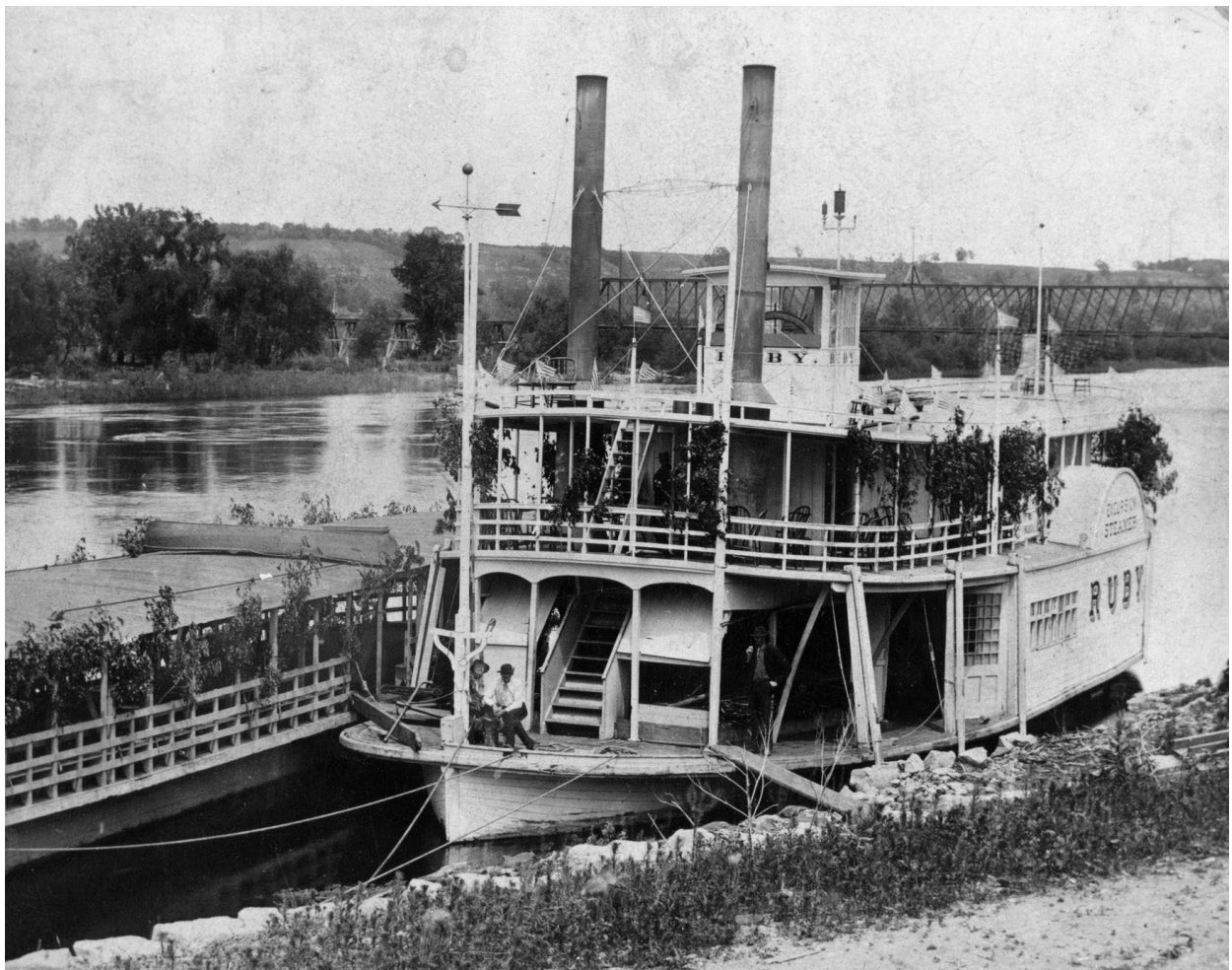
The Buffalo River divided town of East London and the German settlers on the river at Panmure. In 1858 the British Kaffrarian Government built a pontoon ferry to allow the two evolving communities to trade. The pontoon was replaced in 1875 by a steam powered ferry in order to allow more pedestrian and cargo traffic to cross the river.

Pedestrians were charged a fee of 3d to use the ferry during daylight hours and a shilling after nightfall. The East London Municipal Board introduced paper tickets in May 1877 which passengers would present to the ferryman from books they purchased. At this time the daylight fare was dropped to 1d to encourage more passengers to use this new service. In February 1880, the Municipal Board decided to introduce the 25mm copper 1d ferry tokens as the printing of books was becoming a costly exercise. The tokens were minted at the East London firm Wetzlar and Hammerschlag.

Listed in Smith's 1981 Catalog as South Africa, East London #320-A with a valuation of \$10.00. The tokens were successfully used for many years before being withdrawn from circulation. They are uncommon but not rare. Two examples have been listed on eBay in April of 2025. The first sold for \$28.63 receiving 6 bids. The second example is listed at a "Buy it now" price of \$60.00 or best offer and has not sold.



The original pontoon boat service was started in 1857 and is shown in the postcard image following. The second image shows the "Ruby" steam powered ferry that entered service in 1875. The ferry service was eventually replaced by a permanent bridge.

Everett City Lines - One Fare Token - Washington # 300-G By Curtis Judge

The transportation operations of Puget Sound Railway and Light was taken over by Everett City Lines on Feb 20, 1939. Streetcars were eliminated shortly after the purchase and bus operations were expanded. The company operated a fleet of 21 General Motors TD 3609 diesel buses over 20 route miles. In the late 1950's ECL was experiencing financial difficulty and sold out to Everett Bus System.

Everett City Lines issued 5 different fare tokens during its operations. The 16mm brass variety shown below is listed in the Atwood-Coffee transit catalog as Washington 300-G and given a valuation of \$0.35. 30,000 pieces of the token were minted in 1946. All the tokens issued by Everett had the letter "E" stencil cutout of the token. This example is currently listed (5-2025) on the eBay auction site with a buy it now price of \$11.99. It has not sold due to the high asking price for a relatively common token. Two other examples have sold using buy it now listings in the last 3 months for \$1.99 and \$4.99.



This photo shows one of the GM TD 3609 Buses used by Everett City Lines.



When a passenger needed to switch lines during a ride, they were issued a paper transfer. The transfer allowed boarding another bus without paying an additional fare. The transfers were punched with the direction, day and time of travel and were required to be used within a certain time limit.

A.P. Scofield Livery Hack and Bus Line – Minot, N.D. Atwood #600-J

In the early 1900's the railroad reached Minot, the population grew quickly, and transportation services were required. A. P. Scofield operated a Livery stable, Hack and Bus line to provide transport between the depots and The Hotel Morrill. The hotel was located on the southeast corner of Main St. and 1st Ave. It was the premier hotel in Minot providing comfortable lodging, food and drink. The hotel was predominately a wooden structure, a major fire burned it to the ground in January of 1943.

Scofield issued a single token advertising his services that was good for a return fare to the depot from the hotel. A customer paid in advance for a round trip and a token was given to the rider that was presented for the return fare. The token is rare and has been listed as N.D. 600-J in the Atwood-Coffee transit catalog. It is 29mm in diameter struck in brass with unknown quantity. A-C catalog valuation is \$400.00. A February 2024 eBay auction of the example shown below realized \$406.00 receiving 15 bids.

WV 240 A Grafton Traction Co. began operations in February 1908, and later was renamed Tygarts Valley Traction Company.

WV 240 B Issued by Grafton Transportation Co. The initials on the reverse of the token stand for:
“Gretchen Aliexis Alessandra Penelope Lawson, Poochie Judy Kitty, William Clifford Lawson, Agnew Ward Lawson, Ann Cornelia Grovanna Wilhelmina Victoria Lawson”

These were members of the owner's family. The Latin Motto translates to “Honesty is the best policy”
