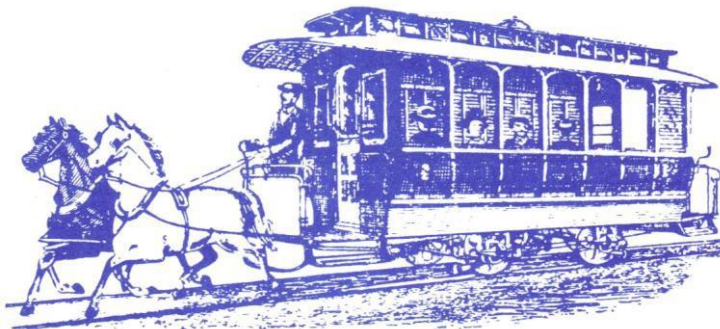

Convention Auction Observations & Comments

This year's Auction results were less than stellar - in fact one might say "cellar...ish". In previous years the gross sales were in the \$6000 to \$ 6500 range. This year the amount was a little over half of those figures. 171 out of 408 lots (42%) sold. That means that 237 (58%) did NOT sell!

A possible reason could be that the economy was "uncertain". With all of the turmoil in the financial world, many people were not sure how it would affect them personally. A lot of folks took a conservative approach. - "Save. Don't spend too much. Wait and see. You may need the funds for something else." etc. The number of mail bidders remained rather constant but the number of lots bid upon (and the dollar amount of those bids) was considerably less than in former years. This year, as in the past, I had accepted almost every token/ item that was submitted (except for duplicates). A number of submitters resent tokens that had failed to sell in previous Auctions. Maybe 2 out of every 10 of these sold this time. It's my opinion that both contributed to the decline in sales.

Category-wise, the Convention tokens were a bust. Only 1 lot out of 42 sold. I guess that at this time, most folks seem to have the Convention tokens they need. Two lots of Car Wash, one of Parking and 9 of 18 Combination lots were sold. Last year none sold. Maybe people are beginning to discover these categories? The Miscellaneous Memorabilia had good results - 38 of the 46 lots offered sold (84%). Since its inception in 2021, more and more interest has been shown in this area. The same may gradually happen with the Car Wash, Parking and Combos. Only time will tell.

The membership falls into one of four collecting categories. (1) The newest members are busy gathering the inexpensive "common" tokens. There are plenty to be found. The Auction doesn't fit their needs. Within a few year's time, they accumulate most of what they can find and (2) graduate to tokens in the \$5, \$10 and \$20 range. There are other members (3) who have been collecting for a while and pursue the more costly \$50 and \$100 ones. Finally, there are those (4) looking for the hard to find (and expensive) tokens in the \$150, \$200, \$500 and up range. I'm looking to offer tokens that appeal to members in the last 3 groups.

The Auction is a nine month a year operation. Gathering, assembling, selling and redistributing the tokens and monies takes a lot of time and effort. It's a little disheartening when the response is poor. It's also a bit of a downer for the submitters. They spend effort and money (Postage isn't cheap anymore.) with little results. The Auction platform makes it easy for members to sell no longer wanted tokens. The only effort needed is send in the token(s) and wait 6 months for a hopeful sale. It's decidedly easier that doing it yourself.

Something needs to be done to stimulate interest/ sales. This upcoming year I think we will follow a slightly different route. Any token/ item that did not sell in the 2025 Auction will not be accepted in 2026. I realize that this seems radical. I'm trying to avoid a situation of "Seen that one last year. Don't need it. Why waste time looking through the rest of the list?" If all of the offerings are new, hopefully folks will examine the listings more carefully. That can generate more excitement and increase more & higher bids. My goal is to keep the tokens moving. I want to make it that the buyers can find what they need and sellers can generate some extra cash. If that happens the hobby benefits. Maybe this change can help. I feel it's worth a try. Changing nothing will probably yield the same outcome.

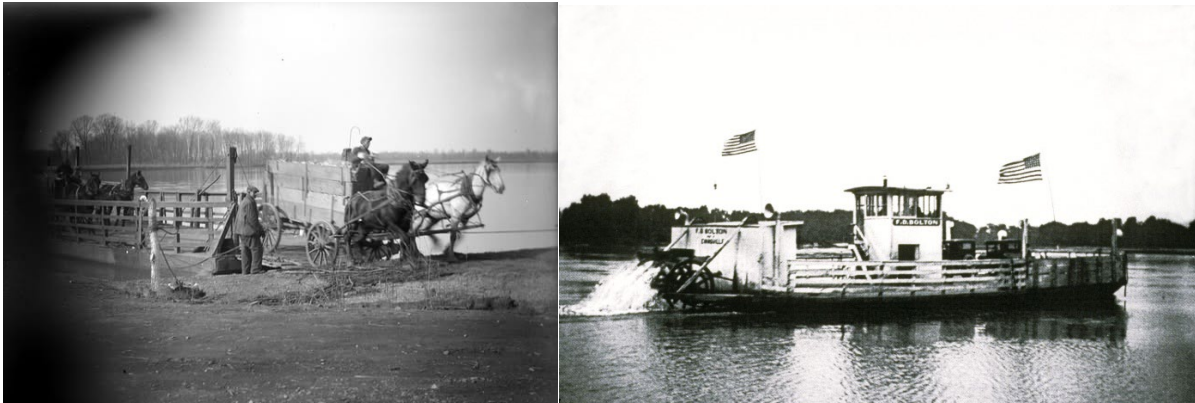

New Harmony Ferry – 1 Auto Trip Token – Indiana # 700-F - Curtis Judge

In the 1920's the New Harmony Ferry was established to move vehicles and passengers from Illinois to the growing town of New Harmony, Indiana. The ferry was a gas engine powered small pontoon boat at the start. Later it was upgraded and enlarged several times as traffic increased. In 1930 a for profit toll bridge was built by the Harmony Way Bridge Co. in close proximity to the ferry docks. A price war ensued fighting for customers. Both operators survived with the bridge eventually being declared obsolete by the state in 2012 and closing. The ferry is still operating.

This first photo image shows the ferry in the 1920's. The second generation boat is shown in the following image.



The final photo shows the latest generation boat and the obsolete closed bridge behind it in the distance.



A single 24X33 mm aluminum token is known that was issued by The New Harmony Ferry Company.

The token is listed in the Atwood-Coffee transit catalog as Indiana,

New Harmony # 700-F being given a valuation of \$25.00.

The example shown below sold for \$39.95 in a September, 2025 eBay auction.

The oval shape and unusual value brought a bid above catalog for this rather plain looking average condition token.

Societa Anomina Degli Omnibus (SAO) Fare Token – Milan Italy 520-A

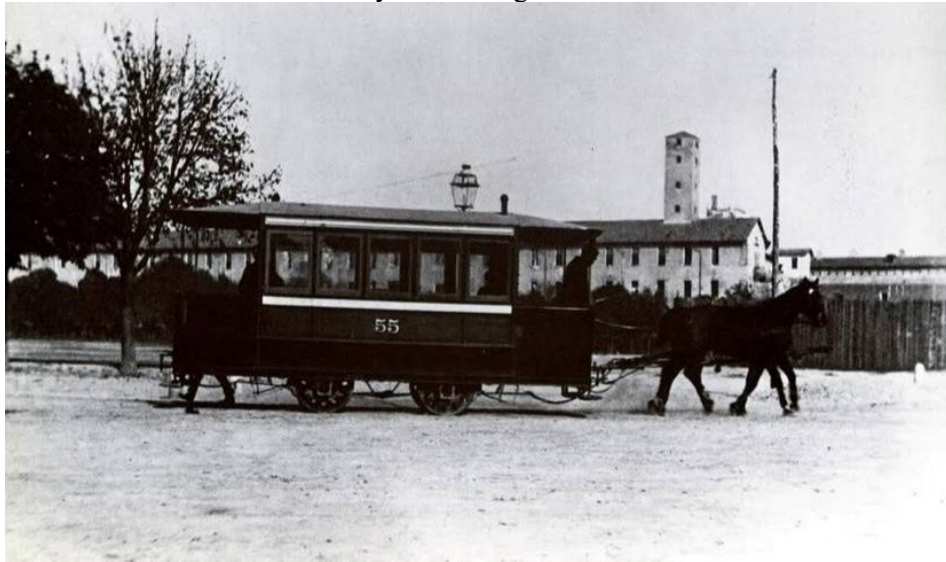
The Società Anonima Degli Omnibus was founded in Milan on June 28, 1861, by Emilio Osculati, to consolidate and operate the city's omnibus lines. Once granted the concession, the SAO began operating three lines on January 1, 1862, gradually expanding to eleven lines by 1865. Tickets cost ten cents, except for connections to the train station, which cost twenty-five cents. Rides ran every five minutes. The one-horse, eight seat carriages were gradually replaced on the main lines by two-horse, fourteen or sixteen seat carriages. The company continued to profitably expand

In 1892, Milan granted Edison Electric Co. the right to construct an experimental electric tramway, which was activated the following year. Given the good results, in 1895 the municipal administration decided not to renew the concession to SAO, and to transfer it to Edison with the aim of electrifying the entire network. Shortly after, SAO was placed into liquidation and integrated into the Edison group.

SAO issued two tokens. The first is shown below and is seldom offered for sale. The 28mm bronze token is listed in Smiths 1990 international transit catalog as Italy, Milan 520-A. Catalog valuation is given as \$20.00. This example is currently, Sept. 2025, offered on the eBay Italian site at a buy it now price of 239 Euro or 283 USD. No other previous sale data could be located for comparison purposes. The obverse has a very nice pictorial of a horsehead.



This photo of car #55 shows the early 8 seat type carriages operated by SAO.
They used a single horse.



As passenger traffic increased the original carriages on the main lines
were replaced with 16 – 18 seat two horse varieties.

There are many collectors who feel they are compelled to find a State and City home for every Parking Token. That may be true for other types of tokens but not for Parking and Transportation Tokens. The Parking Tokens that are used for parking a vehicle in a State-City location should have that information used to provide the token a home in a catalog.

The tokens that are not used to park a vehicle or do not have a State-City location are placed in groups of special ids. in the catalog. XA, YA, ZA, PSTA, PTUN, PTMS, PSTM, PTON, PTFA, PTRE and PTER are the ids. used. Tokens in the eight "P Groups" amount to 18.5% of the total Parking Tokens in TC.COM. They are listed in the Non-Local and Unknown categories. The method is the same for Transportation Tokens but they use different labels for the ids.

Collectors are adding tokens to the TC.COM Parking Token Catalog by identifying them as Parking Tokens but do not contain the total id information. Note: Thanks to Rich Greever, I get a notice when there is an activity in the data base and will up-date the posted ids. I have no problem doing it and use the information to put them in News and Views. Thanks to those collectors for sharing the information of a new token they found.

New Town Toll Gate Token – R. Josephs – Van Diemen's Land 1855 **Smiths Tasmania 901-A&B - Krause KM -TN -141/142** By: Curtis Judge

Van Diemen's Land, (1642–1855), was the southeastern Australian island penal colony that became the commonwealth state of Tasmania. The colony was named for Anthony van Diemen governor general of the Dutch East Indies. Reuben Josephs was born in London in 1790 and was a tailor by trade. He and his brother sold old clothes from a warehouse in London, until he was convicted of receiving stolen goods. On 25 October 1827 he was sentenced to fourteen years confinement and sent to Van Diemen's Land. He was granted his certificate of freedom in 1841. In 1852 he won the tender to operate the New Town toll gate for three years. It was during this time that he issued his two trade tokens, known as 'Toll Gate' tokens, which would have enabled him to profit from giving change to people passing through his gate.

Two tokens of similar design were issued by Josephs dated 1855. The first was a copper 28mm One Penny mule token, this token is shown below. The second token used the same obverse and reverse designs but was 34mm in diameter being struck in bronze metal. Both tokens were minted by W.J. Taylor Co. of London in unknown quantity. The tokens are listed in Smiths 1967 catalog as Tasmania 910-A – Copper and Tasmania 910-B in bronze. The tokens are also listed in the Krause World Coins reference as KM-TN 141 and TN 142. These tokens are not rare and frequently show up for sale on eBay. In July 2025 there were three sales of these tokens realizing \$25, \$29 and \$32.00, pricing realized was dependent on the token's general condition.
